### The Index of Multiple Deprivation

Thirsk & Malton has an IMD rank of 19,116. This means that Thirsk & Malton has higher levels of deprivation compared to North Yorkshire (20,233) and lower levels of deprivation compared to England (16,746).

### Unemployment

The proportion of working age people receiving benefits for unemployment in Thirsk & Malton was 1.71% in Dec-2025. This is similar to the average across North Yorkshire (1.93%) and lower than the average across England (3.94%).

### Housing

The average property price for all dwelling types in Thirsk & Malton was £319,177 between Dec-2024 to Nov-2025. This is higher than within North Yorkshire (£313,569) and lower than the average within England (£355,490).

### Crime

There were 4,184 total crime offences in Thirsk & Malton between Dec-2024 to Nov-2025, with the overall crime rate being 39.8 per 1,000 population. This is lower than the average across North Yorkshire (51.9) and lower than the average across England (91.0).

## Health

8.07% of the working-age population in Thirsk & Malton are receiving Personal Independence Payments (PIP). This is similar to the proportion in North Yorkshire (8.23%) and lower than the proportion in England (9.6%).

## Long-Term Physical/Mental Health Conditions

In Thirsk & Malton, the proportion of people disabled under the Equality Act with their day-to-day activities limited a lot is 6.97%. This is similar to the proportion in North Yorkshire (6.83%) and similar to the proportion in England (7.33%).

## Education

There are 5,432 people in Thirsk & Malton with an apprenticeship as their highest qualification, 6.82% of all people aged over 16. This is similar to the average for North Yorkshire (6.57%) and higher than the average for England (5.32%).

## Employment

There are approximately 28,535 full-time jobs and 13,612 part-time jobs in Thirsk & Malton. The proportion of full-time jobs in Thirsk & Malton (67.55%) is higher than the proportion in North Yorkshire (66.31%) and lower than the proportion in England (69.65%).

## Communities and Environment

Thirsk & Malton has an overall CNI rank of 12,965. This means that Thirsk & Malton has higher levels of community need than North Yorkshire (15,236) and higher levels of community need than England (17,040). A lower rank indicates that an area has relatively higher levels of need.

- **Civic Assets:** measures the presence of key community, civic, educational and cultural assets in a close proximity of the area. These include pubs, libraries, green space, community centres, swimming pools – facilities that provide things to do often, at no or little cost, which are important to how positive a community feels about its area.
- **Connectedness:** measures the connectivity to key services, digital infrastructure, isolation and strength of the local jobs market. It looks at whether residents have access to key services, such as health services, within a reasonable travel distance. It considers how good public transport and digital infrastructure are and how strong the local job market is.
- **Active and Engaged Community:** measures the levels of third sector civic and community activity and barriers to participation and engagement. It shows whether charities are active in the area, and whether people appear to be engaged in the broader civic life of their community.

## **Air Quality**

Thirsk & Malton's estimated concentration of Nitrogen Dioxide is 0.42. This is lower than the concentration in North Yorkshire (0.51) and lower than the concentration in England (1.07). A higher concentration indicates that an area is experiencing higher levels of deprivation.

## **Funding**

The total amount awarded from ALL grant giving organisation types per 10,000 of population from Dec-2024 to Nov-2025 in Thirsk & Malton is £28,870. This is lower than the amount of funding per 10,000 of population across North Yorkshire (£67,470) and lower than the amount of funding per 10,000 of population across England (£148,452).

## **Car Ownership**

In Thirsk & Malton, 12.17% of households have no access to a car or van. This is less than the proportion without access to a car or van in North Yorkshire (15.71%) and less than the proportion without access to a car or van in England (23.54%).

## **Connectivity**

Thirsk & Malton has an overall Connectivity Score of 37.79. This means that Thirsk & Malton has lower levels of connectivity to North Yorkshire (46.37) and lower levels of connectivity to England (64.81). It is calculated using journey planning algorithms considering actual transport networks and service timetables, the total value of all destinations within reach, and the propensity to travel to each destination type by each transport mode at different times of day.
